Advice for all visitors

Procedures for Visitors

- All visitors MUST sign in at the school Main Entrance, using the sign in system.
- Please wear your visitor lanyard at all times.
 - You will remain under the supervision of a staff member unless a NCC badge or DBS is shown.
 - This leaflet outlines out safeguarding expectations.
- Mobile phones must not be used by visitors whilst in school.
- Visitors must hand their badge into the school office to ensure that their sign out has been logged.

First Aid

 If you are working with a child and they need first aid please inform a member of staff who will take the child to the office or the first aid area.

Fire Assembly

 If the fire alarm sounds whilst you are in school please ask a member or staff to show you the nearest fire exit. Posters regarding fire assembly points can be found around school.

What do I do if I am worried about a child

- If you are worried about the conduct of any visitor, volunteer or member of staff please ask to speak with our Head Teacher- Mrs Heidi Hollis or the Deputy Head Teachers—Mr Steve Parry or Mrs Rachael Jurkiw
- Your concern will be recorded on our electronic system— My Concern



Safeguarding tips



Listen and give children time to talk



Never tell a child that you can keep a secret. Inform them that you have to speak to a safeguarding lead



Don't change any of the language they use. We record using the child's own words.



Don't ask any further questions. A DSL may do this if necessary.



If you are unsure whether a concern should be passed on or not please speak to a DSL, no concern is too small.



Remember that safeguarding is everyone's responsibility and we all have a part to play.
