Road safety

Some parents/carers have been speeding outside school. I say to them...*PLEASE STOP DRIVING FAST OUTSIDE SCHOOL*!! Don't be the parent who causes an injury or even worse to one of our Dunkirk children.

-All drivers observing speed limits of no more than **20 mph outside school** (or even slower please)

-parents reminding and ensuring <u>children get out of cars on pavement side</u> -stop parking on the zig zag or yellow lines. They are there for a reason.

If your child rides a bike to school, they SHOULD have a helmet on too. The helmet should fit on the forehead and be strapped on securely. This is so that in a fall, the helmet hits the concrete floor first and not your child's head.

Names in Uniform

Please spend half an hour, one evening, putting your child's name in their uniform, especially winter coats and red school jumpers (as lots of children remove them during playtimes!). If you need emergency uniform, then please let us know. <u>We have spare uniform</u>.

Cold weather Uniform

Please remember that we adjusted our uniform so children can wear jogging bottoms or leggings so there is no need to change for PE.

Please make sure all uniform follows the school colours:

• Polo shirt in red or white

- Sweatshirt/jumper/cardigan in red
- Skirt/shorts/trousers/tracksuit bottoms/leggings in black or dark grey
- Socks or tights in black/red/white/dark grey
- Shoes/boots should be black. Trainers should be black (NOT blue or red etc)
- Warm and dry winter coat (essential as we go out in snow and rain at Dunkirk)

Please note that pink, green, blue etc are not school colours even on PE days.

PE clothing should be red, black, grey or white top and black or grey bottoms please.
