Review: last year's aims and outcomes

Aim	Outcome
Progress in reading, writing and maths	Progress rates in KS2 were improved for disadvantaged pupils in 2021 despite the interruptions caused by the Covid pandemic They were well above the national average in all subjects
Phonics	59% of all pupils met the phonics screening test expectations.
	Of the pupils who were with us for the full school, this figure increases to 73%
	61% of disadvantaged pupils met the expected level, with this figure increasing to 65% of those who attended Dunkirk for the complete Year 1 and were not disapplied.
Attendance	There was no improvement in attendance during 2019-20.
	This can be solely attributed to the Covid pandemic that caused interruptions to the school and to parental anxiety which caused a larger degree of absence.
