



continent	A large amount of land with many countries in it.	
ocean	A large amount of sea between continents.	
beach	A sandy or pebbly place where the land meets the sea.	
cliff	A large, steep rock at the edge of the sea.	
island	Land that is surrounded on all sides by water.	
coast	The part of a piece of land that is near to the sea.	
city	An area that has many buildings and lots of people living there.	

About the world:

- Amelia Earhart was born in 1897 and lived until 1937.
- Amelia Earhart was a pioneer who raised the profile of women in aviation and broke many records with her flying.
- Mae Jemison was an engineer, physicist and astronaut who became the first black woman in space.
- There are 7 continents: Africa, Asia, Europe, North America, South America, Australasia and Antarctica.
- There are 5 oceans: Pacific, Atlantic, Indian, Southern, Arctic
- Land use can be described by observing natural features such as cliffs and beaches at the coast.
- An island describes an area of land surrounded by sea. The UK is made up of two islands.
- Human geographical features include cities, towns and villages.
- Other countries have different climates, population and land use compared to the UK.
