# **Children's next steps**

In school, the majority of children's next steps are academic, whereas our next steps are linked to the child's development holistically. Examples might be as simple as 'putting on own coat and zipping it independently', or 'washing hands independently before snack' or something like 'holding a conversation with an adult' or 'making friends'.

In order to decide these next steps, it is important we have conversations with the children's teachers, the children, and you. We need your help...


