About the world:

- The empire of the Islamic Golden Age stretched across Europe, Asia and North Africa.
- The empire was one of many empires at the time and all of them had some form of contact.
- The city of Baghdad was central to the early Islamic civilisation and its circular design was unique at the time.
- A Caliph ruled the empire and these Caliphs belonged to different family groups at different times including the Umayyad and Abbasid Caliphates.
- Learning and education was an extremely important part of the Islamic Golden Age with books being central to this.
- The prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) is fundamental to the Islamic faith and its teachings.
- Then and now, Islam consists of different groups and denominations
- The Islamic Golden Age ended due to invasion by the Mongol armies.

We will also be creating a trolley to take back in time for the House of Wisdom to move their books.


Take Action!


We will be creating our very own House of Wisdom for parents and carers to visit and see our achievements from across autumn term including the things we have created and written.
