



## Sport Premium 2018 - 2019

**The school expects to receive £19,000**

Consultation with staff and pupils to develop enhanced PE playground facilities across both campuses and after school coaching opportunities:

**This will be spent as follows:-**

1. New zoned play areas
2. New floor layout to promote sports/physical activities
3. Football rules board for each campus
4. New layout and organisation of sport resources at Highfields campus to support use of equipment by staff
5. Basketball coaching KS2 by Nottingham Wild Cats
6. Lunchtime sports coaching at Abbey Campus
7. Increase of after school basketball club coaching opportunities
8. Use of minibus to encourage greater involvement in sports tournaments across both campuses

**Expected Impact:**

- 85-95% pupils report high levels of enjoyment at lunchtime
- Reduction in playground incidents caused by sports issues
- Increased number of pupils accessing basketball activities during and after school



## **Sport Premium Funding 2017 - 2018**

**The school received £19,430**

**This was spent as follows:-**

Consultation with staff and pupils to develop enhanced PE playground facilities across both campuses:

1. New goal posts for football
2. New netball posts for lunchtime engagement
3. New sports resources at Abbey campus to encourage a greater range of sports activities taught
4. New layout and organisation of sport resources at Abbey campus to support use of equipment by staff

**Expected Impact:**

- 95%-100% pupils report high levels of enjoyment in PE
- Reduction in playground incidents caused by sports issues
- Increased number of pupils accessing sports activities
- 95%+ pupils can talk positively about playtime sports activities

**Impact seen:**

- Children now have specific goal areas on each playground which has encouraged competitive scoring games
- Children have received specific training sessions on how to use the new equipment and the range of games activities they can play
- Early years opportunities for co-ordination teaching has increased through focused teaching sessions to develop hand and eye co-ordination
- PE teaching skills developed for targeted staff, primarily focused on developing team sports skills and safety awareness



## Sport Premium Funding 2016 – 2017

**The school received £9,000**

**This was spent as follows:**

- Utilising coaching to deliver PE lessons alongside teachers. This was designed to develop teachers' subject knowledge, confidence and creativity. The coach also supported teachers planning.
- Developing additional competitive matches for sports teams with other schools.

**Impact seen:**

- Increased number of competitions attended (KS2) with successful competitive performance seen.
- Improved teacher skills, especially with varied hall fitness activities
