

Pupil Premium at Dunkirk Primary School

The Use of the Funding

Dunkirk Primary School received a total amount of £68,000 in 2013-2014 for Pupil Premium (PP). The money was allocated into two specific areas of support to ensure that children who have been eligible for free schools meals in the last six years made good to outstanding progress and that the gap between non and free school meals children was narrowed in reading, writing and maths.

PP money is allocated each year to support curriculum enrichment to provide a greater range of life and learning experiences and challenge for our children. For example, to write successfully about life in a forest, a child needs to experience being in a forest and using drama to explore how you feel and respond in such a situation.

The other area that PP money is allocated to is support to ensure children have the necessary skills and knowledge to address the gaps in their understanding and achieve age-related expectations. This is achieved as a result of specific targeted and time bonded interventions.

To achieve the points above there is an emphasis on the role and impact of speaking and listening as part of the learning process and that learning should be a creative and engaging experience.

For 2014-2015 Dunkirk has received a total of £83,000 of PP funding. We will continue to use the money on targeted support to identify specific gaps in children's learning and deliver interventions to address children's misconceptions. This impact is tracked and monitored. We will also be introducing a system that will enable us to evaluate the cost effectiveness of each individual intervention against the impact on children's learning.
